A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

The letter of James in today's readings express what faithfulness to God looks like. James singles out the most vulnerable in society at that time – the widows and orphans. They were totally dependent on the goodness of their community. St. James teaches that it is not enough to just listen to the Word and to respond to it privately within one's own soul—the Word needs to be responded to in real acts of concern and justice.

What about us today? When we hear the Word of Scripture in the Liturgy, do we just listen to it or do we hear the deep challenge to put this Word into action in our lives. Are we genuine, active Christians?

There are many vulnerable people around us who slip through the cracks of our social system. James uses an image today when he says, "we should be a sort of first-fruits of all that God has created."

St. James speaks of the first fruits as signs of the harvest, the model of what is to come that is the kingdom of God. Christians are called to be the models of how humans are to live as members of the kingdom; faithful servants of God by being faithful servants of His people. People should be able to look at us and say that's what being a follower of Christ means.




Think about your own work. How does the work you do show your love for others? As a student, studying and learning and being friends with your classmates is some important work that you do.
