A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

God sent his son, Jesus, the Christ, the Anointed One to fulfill the words of the prophet Isaiah: *He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to captives*... There are so many voices crying out to us for help today from all sides, but, they are not always easily heard or understood. These voices themselves are not always sure what they need or want.

We live in a world that lives in much physical poverty, but, also in great spiritual poorness. People are looking and searching for freedom from the anxieties of their daily lives. They feel captive and bound to a way of life that only ties them down. Lives meaning and value has, for them, been centered on social trends that are fleeting, quickly replaced by something that promises a greater joy.

Through the Sacrament of Baptism, we all share in the priesthood of Christ, the Anointed One of God. The spirit of the Lord, our God, dwells within us, giving us the power to release those held captive by the promises of a world that cannot of itself bring us true freedom from our human condition and sinfulness. Left on our own we cannot restore the Lord's justice in the world. Only Christ, who took upon himself our human nature, can free us from whatever imprisons us in anxiety and broken hearts. Christ truly understands our broken hearts and he alone can free us from whatever holds us down from living in true joy with the Father.

Christ is our source of joy, freedom and salvation, because he humbled himself, by taking our human nature that we might share in his divine nature and be one with God in Holiness. Sharing in Christ's priesthood, we must also humble ourselves that we too may bring joy, freedom, and justice to our world. We must humbly allow the spirit of the Lord to take hold of us and make us his anointed ones, sharing in the voice of Christ, who is the source of all holiness.

SIMBANG GABI is a devotional nine-day series of Masses attended by Filipino Catholics in anticipation of Christmas. Simbang Gabi originated in the early days of Spanish rule over the Philippines, around 1669, as a practical compromise for farmers who began work in the fields before sunrise to avoid the noonday heat. Priests began to say Mass in the early mornings instead of evening novenas that were more common in the rest of the Hispanic world. This cherished Christmas custom eventually became a distinct feature of Philippine culture, community and sharing.

Our parish will host one of the Simbang Gabi novena Masses this Advent on Friday, December 16 at 7pm. Cardinal Cupich will be presiding.

Mark your calendars and join us for this joyful celebration as we wait in hope for the coming of our Savior's birth.

On my behalf and that of the entire parish staff, may your Christmas be filled with the sounds of Christmas joy. May this coming year of 2023 keep us embraced in the peace and love of the Lord through the intercession of Our Lady of Loretto and St. Germaine.

The Lord's Highway

Our theme for this Advent is "The Lord's Highway." The reading from the book of Isaiah on this first Sunday invites us to "climb the Lord's mountain," and to "walk in the light of the Lord." We know that the gospel message of John the Baptist is to "prepare the way of the Lord," and "make straight his path." The Psalms too speak of the joy of "going up to the house of the Lord." This Advent, we will reflect on our journey along the Lord's Highway. Like any journey, we look for the directions to reach our destination.

The season of Advent isn't really designed to be a countdown to the celebration of Christmas. Instead, it is a time of preparation for Christ's return and the establishment of the kingdom of God. It is a reminder that we are heading someplace; we are works in progress; we are longing for something more. That's the true call of Advent. At the same time, we are indeed looking back. We remember the Incarnation, when God broke into our history and became present in an astonishing way. We also look forward to when Emmanuel—God with us—will be how we live always.

We are traveling the Lord's Highway, this Advent and always. We may not yet be all that

we can be; we may not have yet reached our destinations as the people of God, but we are on the way. We are a pilgrim people who are ready to be embraced by the Lord as we journey. Let's rejoice in our Advent journey even in the struggles of a difficult world, even as we pray for those who are hurting, who are grieving, who are lost and alone. We celebrate and are joyful because our journey along the Lord's Highway will bring us into the wondrous presence of the Lord.




