

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

Our lives are filled with questions. For high school students, at this time of the year, where should I go to college? For parents, how will we be able to afford college? When will I be able to find work? How will I provide food, clothing, and health coverage for my family? When will the job market get better, so I can find a job? At what age will I be able to retire? Our lives are constantly filled with questions; the answers we give can change the direction of our lives and the lives of our families.

If we could only be as certain in our answers, as was John the Baptist when he was asked in today's Gospel, "What should I do?" 

Four Hymns of Advent and Christmas

How are you with Christmas carol lyrics? We all know that Rudolph had a red nose, and that, unfortunately, Grandma got run over by a reindeer. We sing of "golden rings" and "partridges in a pear trees" without even needing a printed copy of the lyrics.

But did you know that the first two chapters of Luke's Gospel contain four hymns that are integral to the story of Advent and Christmas? Although they are not typical of the popular Christmas carols we hear throughout the season, they hold "pride of place" in the liturgical prayers. Three of the four hymns are a part of the official prayer of the Church known as the Liturgy of the Hours, while the Gloria is proclaimed at Mass almost every Sunday. As we examine each of the four hymns, we encourage you to read the scripture texts and reflect on how much beauty and depth they add to the Christmas story. Perhaps, check out YouTube for a musical version of the hymns to listen to as you reflect on the words.



The Magnificat or Canticle of Mary

is found at the beginning of Luke's gospel (Luke 1: 46-55). Most of us think of it as the prayer of Mary when the angel Gabriel announced that she was to be the mother of the Savior. But that's not quite right. The setting is, instead, during her visit to her older cousin Elizabeth, who has just learned that she is to be the mother of John the Baptist. Mary responds to Elizabeth, who calls her "the mother of my Lord."

Her song is one of gratitude for all the things God has done for her, but even more, for all the things God has done for his people. She praises God for his mercy and for the justice he brings to the world. He shows the might of his arm to bring down the mighty and conceited and to lift up the lowly. He fills the hungry and shows mercy to the people of Israel. He fulfills the promise he made to our ancestors by sending a Savior to set us free.

The Magnificat has a prominent place in the daily prayer of the Church. It is a central part of Evening Prayer (Vespers) each day.

The Canticle of Zechariah or the Benedictus (Luke 1:68-79)

follows almost immediately after the story of the Visitation of Mary and Elizabeth. It chronicles another strange story of fullness and birth. Both Elizabeth and Zechariah, a priest in the temple, are long past the age for children. But Gabriel (the same angel that appeared to Mary at the Annunciation) tells Zechariah that he and Elizabeth are to have a child. Zechariah is doubtful at best. As a consequence of his doubt, he is struck mute until after the birth of his son.

After the birth of John, Zechariah's song of praise blesses God for his faithfulness to the people of Israel. He announces to the world that this child of his "will go before the Lord to prepare his way, bringing knowledge of salvation and God's tender mercy.







"Gloria in excelsis Deo"

is the jubilant song of the angels as they announce the birth of Jesus to poor shepherds in the field. The story begins with a quick "Do not be afraid," but the angels quickly promise "peace to his people on earth." Emmanuel, God with Us, is born to save. This very evening heaven and earth are joined together—in the fullness of time.

Glory to God in the highest!

The Canticle of Simeon or Nunc Dimitis (Luke 2: 29-32)

is the prayer of Simeon when Mary and Joseph bring the baby Christ-child to the temple. God had promised Simeon that he would live to see the Messiah. When Simeon took the baby in his arms, he said, "Now let your servant go in peace, your word has been fulfilled." Simeon warned Mary that a sword would pierce her heart with sorrow as the child grew. He also acknowledged the inclusion of all the people of the earth (not just the Jews) in God's plan for salvation: "My own eyes have seen the salvation you have prepared for all people, A light to the Gentiles and a glory for the people of Israel.



This canticle is a part of the last prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours(Compline) for the day. It is recited with a simple antiphon that could easily become a bedtime prayer for all of us: "Protect us Lord, as we stay awake. Watch over us as we sleep, that awake we may keep watch with Christ, and asleep rest in his peace."

Unlike so many of the "pop culture" carols, these four call our attention to the depth of the mystery of the Incarnation and its importance in our lives.





Oplatki Christmas Tradition

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian Times. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatki.

Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing.

This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness.

The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family. The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics

participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share love for one another. Although this tradition is primarily enjoyed by the human members of the family, even the family pets can partake in this meal.


Whereas the wafers are generally white in color, there are colored Oplatki made especially for pets although both colors are edible by people. Traditionally, this symbolizes the animals that were present at Christ's birth. However, in current times, this can also represent the important role that pets play in the family. The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.


