He courageously proclaimed Christ as the Light, as the Lamb of God. He prepared the way of the Lord for others and as a result he himself recognized Jesus as his Lord and savior.

Let us also open a way for the Lord for others that they and us may also recognize the Lord's presence in our lives this Advent and Christmas.

#### **Oplatki Christmas Tradition**

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian Times. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatki. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health,



success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family. The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share love for one another. Although this tradition is primarily enjoyed by the human members of the family, even the family pets can partake in this meal. Whereas the wafers are generally white in color, there are colored Oplatki made especially for pets although both colors are edible by people. Traditionally, this symbolizes the animals that were present at Christ's birth. However, in current times, this can also represent the important role that pets play in the family. The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.







#### **Oplatki Christmas Tradition**

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian Times. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatki. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and for



success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family. The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share love for one another. Although this tradition is primarily enjoyed by the human members of the family, even the family pets can partake in this meal. Whereas the wafers are generally white in color, there are colored Oplatki made especially for pets although both colors are edible by people. Traditionally, this symbolizes the animals that were present at Christ's birth. However, in current times, this can also represent the important role that pets play in the family. The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.







## **Oplatki Christmas Tradition**

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian Times. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatki. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health,, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's upconditional love and f



success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family. The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share love for one another. Although this tradition is primarily enjoyed by the human members of the family, even the family pets can partake in this meal. Whereas the wafers are generally white in color, there are colored Oplatki made especially for pets although both colors are edible by people. Traditionally, this symbolizes the animals that were present at Christ's birth. However, in current times, this can also represent the important role that pets play in the family. The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.





# A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

#### Do You Hear the Bells?

The carillon bells from Our Lady of Loretto Church have been here at Our Lady of St. Germaine Parish for over a year now. They represent a lovely addition that reminds us of the history our two parishes and the promise of our future together.

Church bells for ages have been a way to call the faithful to worship and to mark the hours of prayer for the community. The Liturgy of the Hours, the official daily prayer of the Church, focuses on the recitations of scriptural psalms seven times throughout the day. In ages past, many of the faithful were not able to read or write. That made participation in the "Divine Office" nearly impossible for them.

To simplify the prayer times for the common people, Christians have traditionally prayed "The Angelus" at fixed hours of the day. Six o'clock in the morning, noon, and six o'clock in the evening have been the appointed times for this prayer. Church bells were rung to call the people to participate.

Artist Jean Francois Millet painted "The Angelus" (1857) as a tribute to simple people of prayer. The prayer itself reminds us of Gabriel's ANNUNCIATION to Mary that she was to be the mother of Jesus.

When you hear the bells from Our Lady at St. Germaine, won't you join us for this prayerful tradition?




