

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

"Everyone," that's a word I hear a lot. Most often it doesn't mean "everyone"; it means "me." I think or believe this or that and so "everyone" else must also think or believe this way, and so I can use "everyone" to give credence, authority and strengthen to my way of thinking and acting.

We hear the apostles tell Jesus that, "everyone is looking for you." But, Jesus knew better, they were looking for him to perform signs, wonders, and miracles. But, when he took up the Cross on his shoulders, almost "everyone" disappeared from his side.

And, even though everyone was searching for Jesus to be healed, to be fed, to see him perform signs, wonders, and miracles; Jesus took time to be one with the Father in prayer.

We don't need "everyone" with us all the time, but we do need Jesus with us and we need to be one with the Father through Christ.

In the middle of his extremely hectic public ministry, Jesus always found time to go aside to a lonely place and pray and to be one with the Father. Today's Gospel tells us that it was "long before dawn" that he did this. It may have been his usual practice to pray early in the morning or he may have been restless after the events of the previous day and the thought of what lay ahead. Jesus provides us with a model of using prayer to reflect on events and to prepare ourselves for the day ahead to be with everyone who is looking for us.

We also do need each other, as followers of Jesus, our family and trusted friends. Together, with Christ at our side, we can win over "everyone" to Christ's way of thinking, acting, and praying.






A PRAYER AS I PUT ON MY MASK

February is Teen Domestic Violence Awareness Month

The Our Lady at St. Germaine and St. Catherine's Domestic Violence Awareness Ministry want to let you know that February is Teen Domestic Violence (TDV) Awareness Month. In the coming weeks we will provide you with information that highlights this problem and also give you information about healthy relationships.

How big is the problem?*

TDV is common. It affects millions of teens in the U.S. each year. Data from CDC's Youth Risk Behavior Survey and the National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey indicate that:

Nearly 1 in 11 female and approximately 1 in 15 male high school students report having experienced physical dating violence in the last year.

About 1 in 9 female and 1 in 36 male high school students report having experienced sexual dating violence in the last year.

26% of women and 15% of men who were victims of contact sexual violence, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime first experienced these or other forms of violence by that partner before age 18.

The burden of TDV is not shared equally across all groups—sexual minority groups are disproportionately affected by all forms of violence, and some racial/ethnic minority groups are disproportionately affected by many types of violence.





A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

When was the last time you saw a rainbow? Can you remember the last time the sun peeked through the clouds of winter?

Our first reading tells us how God established the rainbow that we see in the sky as a sign of his covenant with Noah, never to destroy the entire earth again with flood waters. Instead, God promised to give life giving waters that would restore humanity to its original dignity.

This promise is fulfilled in Christ, who gives us this life giving waters in Baptism. But to fully experience these waters and taste the rich flavors and graces that constantly come to us from these waters in the font of Baptism through the Eucharist; we need to take time to experience the emptiness of the desert.

Lent is such a time. But, what will we find as we enter into the desert with Christ? It may very well be the recognition that we never stop to look at the rainbows in our lives. It may be that we never take time to form covenants, that is relationships with those around us, that are energizing, life giving, and fulfilling. It maybe some sin or dark power within ourselves that keeps us from sharing in God's promise of life that is given to us in the waters of Baptism.

At the end of these forty days of Lent, will we discover a rainbow or will we just continue on our way?



Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
