

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

"When's Easter?" This is a question that I am asked a lot. Easter as according to Church rules falls on the first Sunday following the first ecclesiastical full moon that occurs on or after the day of the vernal equinox; and the vernal equinox is fixed as March 21. This means that Easter can never occur before March 22 or later than April 25.


Of course, this isn't what people want to know. They want to know the actual date. This year Easter is on Sunday, April 9th... It is the day we celebrate the resurrection of Christ and our sharing in his life through the waters of baptism.

But, we also recognize as believers that we share in the life of Jesus whenever we receive Christ in the Eucharist. He raises us up, he heals us, he offers us hope, and peace. He opens our eyes to see as he sees into the eyes of the needy, the hungry. Christ opens our eyes to truly see.

When does Easter begin for us? It begins when we see and understand that we must raise others up, offer them hope, and peace and light. When is Easter? It is whenever we raise others up and offer them new sight and life in Christ. We celebrate this new life, not only on Easter Sunday, April 9th, 2023; but also, the life in Christ that we share on each Sunday when we gather together to celebrate the Eucharist.

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.


In Matthew 25:35, it reads:

Hope in the Ashes

Our theme for Lent 2023 is "Hope in the Ashes." In our world today, we all need to find hope! Our world seems at many times to be a place of chaos and division. Our lives have been disrupted by the COVID pandemic, and many of us feel alone. The call of Lent is to find hope in the midst our chaos, division and depression. As God breathed life into Adam and



created him from the dust, God can breathe life into us and renew us in faith, hope and joy if we are open to God's actions. After all, our Lenten experience is a preparation for the source of our greatest hope: The Resurrection.

Each year millions of Christians gather to be marked by the sign of the cross in ashes. Some who come for this holy marking are fully engaged with the life of the Church; others might be more distant from the formal practice of faith. But, the common bond for all of us is a desire for belonging, forgiveness, and redemption. We rejoice that none of us needs to endure life's journey alone. The holy marking of ashes unites us all in the same quest.

The traditional pillars of Lenten practice, prayer, fasting and almsgiving invite us to reach out to all those around us—our friends and family, as well as the stranger and those on the margins. Our participation in these Lenten practices makes visible our belief that we share our journey with every other person.

On Ash Wednesday, St. Paul urges us all to be "ambassadors" for Christ--to carry his message of unity and joy to all we meet. Our actions of compassion and care convey to all those around us that we **share** our Lenten journey to Jesus with all those around us. These actions are clear testimony that we are not alone in our struggles. Our hospitality, friendship, and compassion mark us as true ambassadors of Christ—ambassadors who carry Christ's healing and peace to both those we know and those we do not know. We invite them to be partners with us on the Lenten journey, seeking the forgiveness and feeling of belonging that we find in Jesus Christ. Above all we celebrate our belief in the greatest hope of all—the Resurrection!




