

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

In his letter to the Corinthians, of which we read a small section this weekend, St. Paul chided the people for their arrogance, pride, and attitude of superiority toward their neighbors.

St. Paul in his writings to the Corinthians invites the members of this early Christian faith community to become images of Christ, the welcomer and inviter at both their daily tables and at the Eucharistic Table.

In addressing the people of Corinth and their table practices, at the Lord's Table and their meal tables St. Paul is addressing the ethical demands of the Gospel and its relation to the Eucharist. For St. Paul there can be no distinction or discrimination; hospitality, acceptance, and unity must be practiced.

St. Paul's issue with the Corinthians was that they violated the conditions for authentic Eucharist making their gathering at the Lord's Table not a source of justification, but one of condemnation. For St. Paul it is not possible to have a right relationship with God without respecting and accepting the dignity of others despite their cultural or social differences. There can be no Eucharist in a community that does not respect, accept, or love one another as Christ loved all people.

For St. Paul, a life of justice and charity, a life of caring and sharing is inseparable from the Eucharist. The Church cannot be faithful to the meaning of that Eucharist as handed down to the apostles by Christ, if it is not faithful to his compassionate table actions of service, healing, and reconciliation.

Learning from St. Paul may these days of Lent help us to draw closer to the Lord in the Eucharist by drawing closer to our neighbors through our actions of reconciliation, forgiveness, and service.

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The Ash Wednesday Collection of \$1,263.00 that was scheduled to be sent to Church in Central & Eastern Europe will be go to support the people of Ukraine.

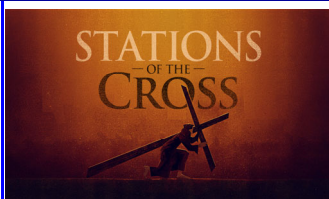
