A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

Our second reading from St. Paul centers on the Cross of Christ and the way it contradicts normal human expectations and the Greco-Roman wisdom of his day. Paul is pointing out that his preaching the message of the cross at Corinth is in total conflict with society's understanding of what makes for success. This continues today.

Paul was attempting to teach the Corinthians to recognize that the relationship between Christians is modeled on the atoning death of Christ as salvation for all people. The body of Christ, the Church that is composed of all of us, is different in the way it acts and behaves from all other earthly bodies be it business, political, or even charitable. Our motivation is to be reflections of Christ by loving as God loves us, the Cross of Christ.

For St. Paul, Christianity has been entrusted with a vision of God reconciling the world to himself in Christ, from the position of the Suffering Servant and not a conquering hero. Jesus is not powerful or authoritarian as many would like to profess and proclaim.

However, the Christ of Paul is not the Christ that many Christians embrace. Their Savior is one who will conquer his enemies with worldly power and might. Paul's Christ is the Son of God, who humbled Himself on the Cross to restore our relationship with God and one another.

We ask ourselves during these days of Lent, what is our image of Christ and is it the same understanding of Jesus, who saves us by the Cross that St. Paul proclaimed to the Corinthians?

2021 A New Lent/Believe, Belong, Become

This past summer when the churches in our diocese opened for mass we were able to witness what it means and how it feels to BELONG. We were locked down in the middle of Lent, our school and Religious Education Program came to a screeching halt, funerals were limited to a very small number of participants, and worst of all Holy Week was only experienced via YouTube. We can look at that as adjusting, and we did that well. But when the doors opened and people came back to celebrating mass together there was a sure sense of the feeling of Belonging. People were happy to be back, masks were not an



issue, and our faith community began to flourish. For those of you who still do not feel comfortable attending in person, that day will come and it will feel oh so good!

This week we read the story of Jesus overturning the tables in the Temple. It was the beginning of Passover, the crowd was immense. It was a good time to peddle their wares. However, Jesus clearly knew who and what belonged there. It was not those concerned about money, it was not a marketplace, and it not for those who disregarded his message that the Temple is a house of sacrifice and prayer. Jesus' expression of



anger isn't what we typically witness, but sometimes necessary. By turning the tables Jesus also turns the script of where and how to worship. This event in the Temple is the precursor to the ultimate sacrifice, resulting in the Resurrection. Jesus becomes the Temple. Jesus invites us each Lent to make changes, maybe subtle changes or more pronounced. As his disciples we learn to follow his example, to belong to His church, and to share in His mission.

How to help your child deal with grief and loss

Expert advice on supporting children through the process

Grief comes in many forms, and at the moment, as we navigate our way through a pandemic, we are all facing different types of loss from being unable to see loved ones in other countries to not being able to hug our friends.



There are also those who have lost loved ones, and, while it's heart-breaking, loss is life and is all part of growing up.

We all cope with grief differently and that goes for kids too. Not only do children grieve differently from adults, but children of different ages also express how they are feeling in surprisingly divergent ways.

Young children may not even understand what death means, or that people who have died won't be coming back. They may worry they have done something to cause the death.

On the other hand, they might not seem too concerned about it, or even go from crying one moment to wanting to play the next. It is also normal for a child to feel angry at the person who has died (or someone else entirely).

As children get older they may begin to understand more, but will still need help from their parents and other caregivers on how to process and cope with loss.

We talk to Maša Karleuša Valkanou, CDA-licensed psychologist at Thrive Wellbeing Centre, who specializes in life transitions, grief, loss and abuse, to get her top tips on helping kids to deal with their grief.

Does grief come in different forms?

Grief can be expressed as sadness, which is the most adequate way to express it, but it can also be expressed as anger, depression, irritability, loss of motivation, will or energy. Children express grief differently, they lose their focus, become more frustrated, irritable and angry. Adolescents may turn to destructive and impulsive behavior, banned substances, promiscuity, reckless driving and self-harm.

What sorts of things will kids be grieving now as we continue to navigate the pandemic? Each individual situation is different; most people had to adjust their lifestyle, give up their usual pleasures and back off on social and family interactions, which is sad. But people can adapt to the change and hope for the better days to come. On the other hand, there are people who lost loved ones and that is the real tragedy. The process of grief is also more complicated, as usual rituals that help the grief are not available, things like being all together or having a memorial service.

What about kids who have lost loved ones in another country, how can parents explain that loss to them?

This is a very important question. Parents are sometimes uncomfortable with telling children sad news, but is vital that parents are honest with their children and keep them informed about reality, even if it is a tragic one. Parents should keep it simple and factual and then sit with a child and patiently answer all the questions that child may have, and prompt some more. Parents should not hide their own emotions – if your eyes tear up, that's good and shows your child they can be sad too. Children should not witness an adult falling apart (sobbing uncontrollably, throwing things, being in an altered state of mind), but they should see the parent being sad and authentic about their emotions.

A lot of little kids won't really understand what death actually means.

The parent should explain death in a simple way, according to their own belief system. It is not important that a child understands it completely, they will with time. It is important not to make up some stories and obvious lies and it is very important to emphasize that there is no fault or blame in death, children tend to blame themselves for everything, they may feel it is somehow their fault. It is ok to offer some explanation that you believe it is helpful, like that the person who passed is in a better place or similar.

What sort of anxieties will parents see in their kids following tragic news?

It is ok if the child is sad, crying, asking questions. If the child is silent for more weeks, express anger, irritability, fears and self-destructive behaviors, parent should talk to the child. If these behaviors last for more than four months the child should receive counselling or therapy to help him grieve.

Do children go through stages of grief?

The first stage is denial, followed by anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance at the end. The child might get stuck in a particular stage, when it is important to seek professional help.

How to support your kids with their grief

Keep these tips in mind


Talk to your children in simple terms, according to their age, but honestly and factually. Do not insist they understand, they will eventually. Do not lie to your children. It is ok to offer some comforting explanation according to own belief system.

Ask questions. You don't have to explain much, rather, ask them what they think. You don't have to know the answers, you can say – that is a really good question, I'll think about it, I don't know.

Do not avoid emotions, questions, difficult topics. The more you talk about them, the less threatening they are. Show your sadness and tears, but don't flood them. Show that being sad is all right, it is safe.


LORD, YOU HAVE THE WORDS



Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Lenten Stations of the Cross will be held Fridays, in Church at 5:00pm. On Good Friday, station will be held at 3:00pm.

Face masks and social distance are required.



Holy Saturday Easter Vigil Mass

The Holy Saturday Vigil Mass will take place at 7:00pm; because of the requirement that the Vigil Mass begins at Sunset. Because of Covid 19 restrictions, the Mass will be an hour or less. There is NO 4:00pm Mass on Holy Saturday. The Rite of Lighting the Holy Fire, the Easter Proclamation, and Blessing of Water will take place earlier on Holy Saturday.

Blessing of Easter Baskets will take place at noon; but outdoors, again because of Covid 19 restrictions.

Palms will be blessed and distributed, however, they will not be passed out until after the Masses as we leave Church.



2021 A New Lent/Believe, Belong, BecomeWHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BECOME AN APOSTLE, AND CAN ANYONE BE AN APOSTLE?

I don't know about you but I was originally taught that there were only twelve men who are considered apostles. And when one of them betrayed Jesus, he was replaced by another. However, in my studies I found that the word apostle means "one who is sent." The Latin term *apostellein* is equivalent to the verb *mittere*,

which means mission. The Four Marks of the Church that we recite in our Creed reminds us that we are One (united with one God), Holy (through our Baptism), Catholic (the fullness of Christ), and Apostolic (deposit of faith handed down from Christ to Peter). Throughout scripture Jesus is often sending out two or three of them to get more food, or lead the way, or prepare a place. Today our mass begins with Jesus sending two of his disciples to bring him a colt. He gives them clear instructions of what to say if someone questions them, so they go a retrieve a colt for him. Today we also read the Passion of Jesus. It's a story we all know well. We are familiar with some of the dialogue and we know how it ends. Prior to Jesus' celebration of Passover he sends two of them ahead to go to the upper room and prepare the Passover Feast. Jesus was very clear on what was about to happen and he prepared his hand-picked apostles over the past few years for this event. We too have been chosen and sent. By our very nature we are missionaries, called to follow Jesus and share the Good News. This weekend is the first two of our four Confirmation masses. Our students have been taught, studied, formed, and Zoomed to prepare for the reception of the sacrament.

Now the choice is theirs. How will the church look after these 55 students are fully initiated Catholics take on the role of disciples or apostles? The Great Commission in Matthew's gospel is to "go and make disciples." Our world has given us many challenges this year. What have we learned about ourselves? How will we recover and more importantly how will we help others recover?



Prayers for the Stazak Family

Jen Stazak (nee Barba) is an alumni, parishioner and longtime office manager for our parish. She is the wife of Earl Stazak, mother of four daughters (all St. Germaine Alumni) and her youngest & only son is currently in school at St. Germaine. Jen & Earl have five grandchildren and both have many siblings. Jen has supported our parish through the ups and downs that we all have experienced. There is not a program or event that is held within our parish or school that Jen hasn't been part in.

Over the past few months, Jen Stazak has been experiencing headaches and impaired vision, which was recently diagnosed as a pituitary tumor, requiring

her to undergo brain surgery to remove. If gone untreated, the tumor could cause blindness. As we all know, this type of surgery will come with an incredible amount of medical bills and a minimum of 6-8 weeks of being unable to work.

With surgery scheduled for a few weeks out, Jen's family has faced another incredible curveball that has dramatically rocked their whole world. Wednesday, March 10, 2021, Jen's husband, Earl, was rushed away by ambulance to find out he suffered a massive stroke— leading to surgery needed on his brain to reduce swelling. He is currently fighting for his life as doctors work to care for him at Christ Hospital's Neuro ICU. We remain positive as we take each day one at a time, and look to God for love, hope and guidance.

To all those that know and love them, Jen and Earl would do anything for anyone that needed help and would ask nothing in return. This is just who they are. Let us all show our love and gratitude for Jen, Earl, and their family by sharing what we can and praying for them to make it through this time. We are asking you to keep them in your thoughts and prayers.
