

Catholic Charities HELP THE HUNGRY AND HOMELESS

A hungry child. A homeless mother. An addict. An immigrant. A frail senior. An impoverished veteran. Catholic Charities protects and serves all these people and many more. In the Southwest area **each day 140 families, twice as many as in past years**, from the Southwest suburbs receive their basic food supply from the St. Blasé Food Pantry. 75 otherwise homeless families are housed in the New Hope Apartments and other transitional housing intended to get families to become independent. 141 units of permanent housing are provided for impoverished veterans, men and women who have served our country. The hot meal program which served more than 9,000 meals to the hungry and the homeless in the Southwest area is now a carryout program. Many of those served are our neighbors. In addition to those served above, 222 individuals from Oak Lawn have received direct emergency assistance.

The Mother's Day Collection for Catholic Charities is on the weekend of May 9-10. Those of you who get Church donation envelopes in the mail will find a special envelope for Catholic Charities. Those who don't can use any envelope and either mail it to the Parish Center (9711 S. If you would like to donate non perishable food, you may drop outside of Church doors and the donations will be checked daily.





Dear Parish Family of Our Lady at St. Germaine,

I gave myself a haircut. The front was easy; not a lot of hair there or on the top. Cutting the sides wasn't that hard with my electric razor. The back of my neck wasn't so easy; but, I can't see it even in a mirror. A very minor sacrifice, for myself, because of the Covid-19. Our lives have been upended in so many ways from baptisms to birthdays, from first communions to graduations, from weddings to 25th and 50th anniversaries having to be celebrated from a distance or virtually. We even have to join in prayer for funerals from a distance and in small groups.



SAINT RITA OF CASCIA (1381-1457) May 22

If you're ever in Philadelphia on May 22, forget parking anywhere near Saint Rita's shrine. Cars line streets and fill medians as throngs pack a candlelight vigil and six Masses, honoring this patroness of lost causes, hopeless situations, and—as her statue in countless churches built by twentieth-century immigrants testifies—difficult marriages, troubled homes, and alienated children. Wise people warn, be careful what you pray for. "Divine Savior," Rita prayed, "let me suffer like you!" Obedient to parents who refused her wish to become a nun, Rita married a man who returned her devotion with twenty years of abuse. When enemies murdered him, Rita's two sons swore revenge. Paintings depict her pointing the angry boys toward Christ crucified, whom she begged to restrain them. Within the year, both sons died. Alone now, Rita went to the convent but was refused. The nuns feared violence, since one of them was related to the murderer. Rita arranged peace between the families, made vows, and became much sought after as a counselor and intercessor for forty years on earth—and ever since in heaven.







A Letter from the Pastor

Reopening Plan for Our Lady at St. Germaine Parish amid COVID-19

Dear Parish Family,

As you may have seen, Cardinal Cupich recently shared our <u>multi-phased plan for reopening</u> <u>churches in the Archdiocese of Chicago</u>. Specifically,

Phase I allows for parishes to reopen for Baptism, Reconciliation, Weddings and Funerals with a limit of 10 attendees.

Phase IA allows for parishes to reopen for private prayer and adoration with a limit of 10 attendees. Phase II allows for reopening for weekday and weekend Masses for larger groups depending on the

guidelines from the state and the capacity of the church building.

First and foremost, it is important for everyone to understand that our efforts will prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all while maintaining due respect and reverence for the sacraments and liturgical norms of our faith.

We have assembled a Parish Reopening Leadership Team with parishioner co-captains to lead our efforts. Together, we will attend required training from the Archdiocese to ensure that our parish reopening plan conforms to the guidelines developed by the Archdiocese in collaboration with civil and healthcare authorities. We will also receive a starter kit of protective and cleaning supplies, as well as guidance on purchasing/maintaining supplies ongoing.

Volunteers Needed

We will also need volunteers to assist with various aspects of our parish reopening plan. Importantly, leadership team members and volunteers must not be part of a "vulnerable population" (that is, not over the age of 65; no underlying medical condition such as diabetes; lung disease; undergoing cancer treatment, etc.). I ask all of you who are younger than 65 and healthy with no underlying health conditions to consider assisting with one of three reopening teams:

- <u>Set-up team</u>. Sample duties include ensuring that all supplies needed for each sacramental celebration/ gathering are ready for use, entrances and exits are marked and propped physically open prior to attendees' arrival/departure, windows are opened, etc.
- <u>Greeting team</u>. Sample duties include assisting in managing the flow of congregants as they enter the church, making sure attendees use hand sanitizer upon entering, are wearing a mask, and are reminded not to enter if ill; directing people to appropriate seating/waiting areas, etc.
- <u>Cleaning team</u>. Sample duties include maintaining and cleaning essential and trafficked areas of the church before and after the church has been used. Masks and gloves will be provided, if you do not have your own, in addition to approved cleaning/disinfecting supplies.

Timing for Our Reopening

As I mentioned, the Parish Reopening Leadership Team members and I will need to complete required training. Once we complete the training, we will need to review and complete tasks assigned to all parishes as part of a reopening certification process to be approved by the Archdiocese. Therefore, the soonest that any parish in the Archdiocese will realistically open for sacramental celebrations, private prayer or Eucharistic Adoration is sometime in June. However, our parish, like all others in the archdiocese, will move forward at a pace and timing appropriate for its own situation.

Following our training and certification approval, at Our Lady at St. Germaine we will only open our church once the Reopening Leadership Team and I feel confident that we have the right volunteers in place to make it possible to reopen. Again, the need for parishioner assistance cannot be overstated.

The guidelines and measures required to reopen are designed to protect our wellbeing and that of the of our broader community. As Cardinal Cupich has noted, from the first pages of Scripture we learn that we indeed are "our brother's keeper." Our Lord Jesus Christ prayed, "that they all may be one" (Jn 17:21) and commanded us "love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (Jn 13:34). Our collective patience, willingness to help and the care we take to reopen is a demonstration of our unity and love for one another.

May God grant you His peace during this difficult time and may He manifest His love and presence to you in abundant ways.


