

HELP THE HUNGRY AND HOMELESS

A hungry child. A homeless mother. An addict. An immigrant. A frail senior. An impoverished veteran. Catholic Charities protects and serves all these people and many more.

In the South and Southwest areas **each month** 3200 individuals from the Southwest suburbs receive their basic food supply from the St. Blasé Food Pantry and an additional 2500 individuals are served through the food pantry at St. Irenaeus. 80 otherwise homeless families are housed in the New Hope Apartments and other transitional housing intended to get families to become independent. Over 200 veteran's families (304 individuals) were assisted through 141 units of permanent housing and other services. Veterans come into the program literally homeless or at risk of losing their homes. These are men and women who have served our country. The hot meal program which served more than 8,500 meals to the hungry and the homeless in the South and Southwest areas is now a carryout program serving about 5,200 individuals. Many of those served are our neighbors. In addition to those served above, 48 families, 84 individuals from Oak Lawn and the surrounding area have received direct emergency assistance throughout the year.

I have a story typical of the situations that seem to surface at Catholic Charities on a regular basis. Around Christmas on one of our coldest days, a 92 year old woman called. She said her water heater had broken. Staff had the water heater checked out. It could not be repaired so Catholic Charities had the water heater replaced. Going through the winter without hot water would have been unbearable. Think of your morning shower!

The Mother's Day Collection for Catholic Charities is on the weekend of May 13-14. Those of you who get Church donation envelopes in the mail will find a special envelope for Catholic Charities. Those who attend

weekend Masses at St. Germaine can take one of the white envelopes that you will find at the three exits. Please help us fight hunger and homelessness in the South and Southwest area by donating to the Catholic Charities Mother's Day Collection.

Catholic Charities is the Catholic Church at its very best.





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you. That word is *priesthood*.

St. Peter says to us, "You are a 'chosen race, a royal priesthood..." To be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry. The whole of our lives, including every detail, is meant to become our acceptable offering to God.

The baptized exercise this priesthood in many ways, I'll mention three. At Sunday Mass, in private prayer, and in daily work. At Mass, we offer the sacrifice of our lives with that of the priest, who symbolizes Christ the Priest. In our prayer, a "morning offering" prayer is a great way to offer up all the joys and sufferings of the day to come. In our daily work, we sacrifice our time, comfort, money, and energy to do good for others. All this gives the deepest possible meaning to our lives: we share in the priesthood which saves the world. That's at the core of our faith.
